<sup>\*\*</sup>Please note: if you earned an ACT Mathematics score of a 22 or higher; an SAT score of a 520 or higher; 69CLM (College Level Math) on the College Board's Accuplacer tests; 50% on the MapleSoft T.A.; 46 on ALEKS for Math; 18 on PlaceU (WebAssign) for Math, by State of Ohio Law you are not required to take remedial math (1050 and/or 1075) regardless of your score on the Mathematics Skills Assessment. A written waiver and adviser permission is required. However, you are strongly encouraged to take the math course you tested into, especially if you are going to continue taking a sequence of math courses.
